This Week At The Capitol:

With the MLK holiday and the Inauguration on Wednesday this was a slow week at the Capitol. Proposed Bills are trickling out and Committees are slowly ramping up...it is a long session after all!

The Children's Committee met on Thursday but did not raise any bills of interest for YSBs. The Judiciary Committee also met, but again, nothing of consequence for YSBs.

Over the weekend, I sent you all a link to an article about the fact that between the increase in the sales and use tax and capital gains, the budget deficit for THIS current fiscal year has been wiped out and is now projected to run a small surplus.

Spiking tax revenue will wipe out state budget deficit, analysts say (ctmirror.org)

The out years of the budget, for the next biennium remains in deficit. It is not as large as it was running, but it remains over a billion dollars in both years. Having said that, the Rainy Day Fund has \$3.1 billion in reserve to cover both years IF that's the direction the Governor and Appropriations Committee wants to go.

In about two weeks we will know more when the Governor delivers his budget address.
