**Re:** Legislative Update

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This Week at The Capitol:

This was a somewhat busy week at the Capitol for CYSA.

On Monday, the Children’s Committee passed, with substitute language, SB 2: An Act Concerning (AAC) Social Equity and the Health, Safety and Education of Children. You can find the bill with its substitute language here: <https://www.cga.ct.gov/2021/kiddata/sl/2021SB-00002-R00LCO05398KID-SL.PDF> The Committee also passed, with substitute language, SB 945: AAC the Sale of Flavored Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems and Vapor Products and Children’s Health. This bill is seen as a potential compromise in that it does not outright ban the sale of flavors and systems for places of business that prohibit under 21-year-olds from their establishments. On Tuesday, the House of Representatives was in session to pass several pieces of legislation including a bill that allows the Legislature to take back some control over the allocation of Federal Relief Funds, as prior to this, the Governor has had all that responsibility. To say that the Legislature wanted to take back control over the power of the purse is an understatement! The Senate will go into session next week to pass it as well.

The Budget process continues to move forward. Subcommittees are holding work sessions to go over questions asked by Members during the Agency presentations. Once this occurs, the subcommittee will deliberate over their pieces of the budget puzzle and then ship them to the Chairs of the Appropriations Committee for review. Chairs will then put the budget together and present it to the Committee as a whole in late April.
