Re: Legislative Update

This Week at The Capitol:

A busy week for YSBs...

The Appropriations' Committee deadline is April 23rd. I expect the budget to come out in the latter part of the week of the 12th.

On Wednesday, the Judiciary Committee met to act on several bills including SB 888, AA Responsibly and Equitably Regulating Adult-Use Cannabis. The bill, as passed, does include 15% of the raised revenue for prevention and intervention. The bill was sent to the Senate Floor for further action which will include being referred to other Committees. Once such Committee will likely be the Finance Committee.

On Thursday, Judiciary once again met (it was Judiciary Committee week as their deadline is/was Friday) to act on 25 bills including HB 6667, AAC the Recommendations of the JJPOC and HB 6669, AAC Juveniles and Motor Vehicle Theft, Investigations of Certain Pending Juvenile Matters and Reporting of Requests to Detain Arrested Juveniles...two bills on opposite spectrums of how they deal with Juvenile Justice issues. But for Rep. Rebimbas, (R-Naugatuck) who voted in favor of HB 6667, all other votes were along party lines. Because auto theft is a big issue in many of the communities represented by members of the Committee, the vote on HB 6669 was all over the place with eight (8) Democrats voting in favor of the Republican sponsored bill. Neither bill is a finished product with further negotiations forthcoming prior to final passage by the House and Senate.
