Re: Legislative Update

This Week at The Capitol:

The week began with the Appropriations Committee meeting to discuss bills referred from the House and Senate. The Chairs are holding firm that debate can only revolve around the cost of the bills before them and not policy. There were three bills of interest for YSBs before the Committee:

1. HB 6111, AA Establishing A Youth Suicide Prevention Training Program, was placed on the consent calendar (one vote for several agreed upon bills).
2. HB 6667, AAC The Recommendations of The Juvenile Justice Policy and Oversight Committee. Sen. Osten let the Committee know that most of the funding for the bill is already in the budget and Leadership is discussing if the remainder can be achieved through available appropriations. (A term the Legislature uses when it wants an Agency to do something with funding they already have.)
3. HB 6669, AAC Juveniles and Motor Vehicle Theft, Investigations of Certain Pending Juvenile Matters and Reporting of Requests to Detain Arrested Juveniles.
No action was taken and the bill died in Committee.

Both the House and Senate were in session this week. The House acted on HB 6110, AAC The Online Sale and Delivery of Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems and Vapor Products. The bill was amended by LCO# 8368, designated Ho. and LCO# 8467, designate Ho. B and passed overwhelmingly. The Senate took no action on bills of interest to YSBs.

Budget negotiations are proceeding...slowly. There is a huge chasm between what Legislative Democrats want and what the Governor is willing to sign. The Speaker is confident a middle ground can be found before the end of the regular session.

The Speaker was not as confident that Adult Use of Cannabis would be agreed to and voted on before session ends on June 9th. For that, he said, he could see a special session or, as he put it "overtime", to act on the measure. Stay tuned!
