




Snapchat is used to send pics and vids - called snaps - to friends. Your friends can view snaps for up to 10 seconds, and then they disappear. You can replay them once however. You can also post pics and vids to your "Story" which stays there for 24 hrs. Your story is visible to all your friends.

SNAP LINGO

- Snapchatters: Snapchat users
- Snaps: Photos or videos taken via Snapchat (you can send a snap to a snapchatter, but it can only be viewed by the recipient for one to 10 seconds before it disappears forever)
- Snapback: A reply to a snap
- **Story:** A snap you can broadcast to followers (recipients can view it an unlimited amount of times in 24 hours, and you can also post multiple snaps to your story in one day to create a narrative of sorts)
- **Scores:** The total number of snaps you have sent and received (appears next to your name in friends' contact lists and vice versa)
- <u>Chat:</u> A feature that lets you privately/directly message friends
- <u>Streak</u>: Keeping a conversation going on for days even weeks with one person without letting too much time go by







Lip syncing App that allows the user to make their own videos. They select their own music or sound bit, ad effects, filters, fast or slow motion, time lapses and reverse options and save it all under their profile that anyone can see.



Negatives


- Share your vids on Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, Messenger, WhatsApp, and Vine
- > If you search the hashtags, kids can see vids with adult content
- >The songs are explicit
- > Most accounts are public so the user can get fans and followers






Protects your "special" photos and videos

- Brows the internet privately without leaving traces
- Download images, videos and files directly from the browser.
- Can create unlimited number of private albums.
- Users are encouraged to store app in utility folder
- Records intruder with photo & GPS



- ► BREAK-IN ALERTS Snaps a picture of anyone who enters the wrong password in an attempt to access your Vault, without letting the intruder know.
- ▶ STEALTH MODE Hide the Vault icon on the phones Home screen. When stealth mode is activated, the icon will disappear and can be opened again by entering your password via the phone dial pad.
- ► FACEBOOK MESSAGES Add a Facebook friend to your Vault app and enjoy secure chats away from Facebook.

Private photo vault offers decoy passwords







BACK TO BASICS



- Parents are overwhelmed by cell phone technology
- Parents are in denial of what their kids are doing and seeing online
- Parents are busy and do not have the time or energy to monitor and check phones & devices
- Parents bury their heads in the sand and pretend it's not happening
- Parents are convinced by their children that the child's cell phone is private like a diary
- Parents do not know how to get started

Benefits

- Eliminating threats (that never get followed through)
- Gives the child clear boundaries where there were NONE
- Opens the line of communication
- Parents get a sense of control

Cell Phone Contract

I know that having a cell phone to use is a privilege. I understand that my parents love me and want to keep me saje.
understand that there are rules to using this cell phone and in order to continue using it, I agree to the following:
I will always answer calls or texts from my parents. If I miss a call or text from them, I will call or text back right
away.
I will always be honest with my parents about my cell phone usage. They must always know my passwords & ar

Cell Phone Contract

- If I decide to put a lock screen on my phone, my parents will know the password or code. My parents will have access to all of my phone call history and text message history.
- I understand that this phone may be taken away if I am on it too much, or if I express negative behavior including talking back or failing to keep up with my chores.
- If my grades drop, I will lose this phone until I have brought my grades back up.
